2024 Highlights

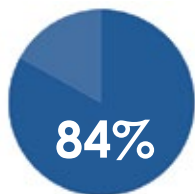
Awarded Federal Grant to serve as a Head Start and Early Head Start provider.

Welcomed 20 healthy babies in our Growing Together Pregnancy support program.

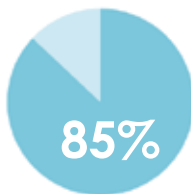
Launched First Connections Autism Services and Support program.

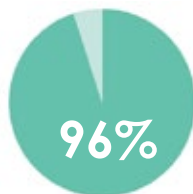

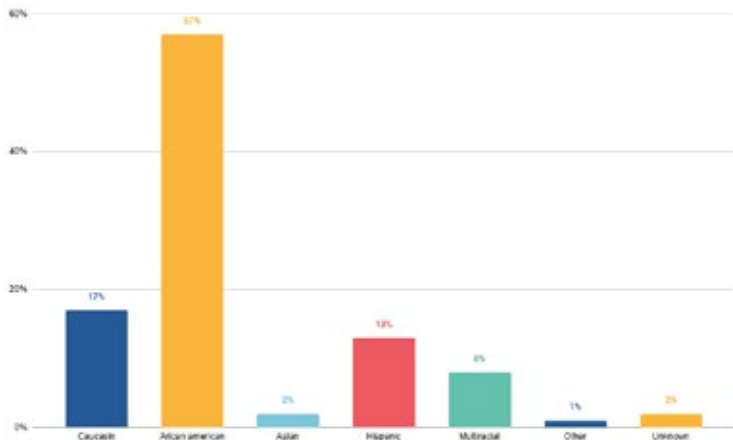

Results

Special Care Nursing Services

52 children received nursing services, with 651 nursing contacts provided for infants, children & families.

Milwaukee County Birth to Three Early Intervention Service at Penfield

1,151 children received Birth-to-Three services.

A total of 13,104 individual therapy sessions were provided including special education, speech, occupational therapy, physical therapy and care coordination.

Behavior Clinic

The Behavior Clinic served 380 children ages six and younger in Milwaukee County.

88.9% of children demonstrated reduced trauma symptoms as measured by the Preschool Inventory of Trauma Symptoms.

76.7% of children reduced their challenging behaviors from pretest to post test as measured by the Early Childhood Behavior Screen.

Early Education & Care

Early Education and Care served 107 children.

83.1% of children demonstrated improvement in social emotional development.

82.6% of children demonstrated improvement in early learning literacy skills.

36% of children in our Early Education and Care program have a disability or developmental delay, such as cerebral palsy or autism.

Growing Together Pregnancy Support

Growing Together provided prenatal resources to 42 expecting mothers in Milwaukee County.

42 expecting mothers received nursing services via Growing Together.

Growing Together welcomed 20 healthy babies in 2024.

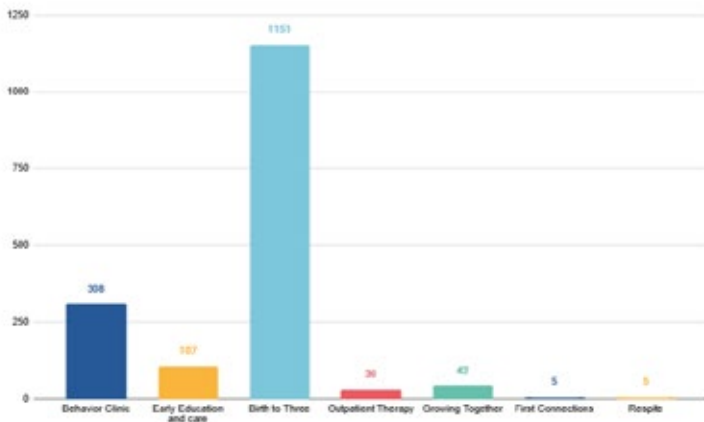
Respite Care

Provided specialized nursing services to 5 children within our Early Education and Care program.

Provided in-home Autism support to 5 children and their families using Pathways Early Autism Intervention model.

A Lifeline for Mothers: Alexia's Story

“My support system is very limited. This program was a nice way to meet other moms and gain more knowledge so I can be the best parent I can be.” – Stacey

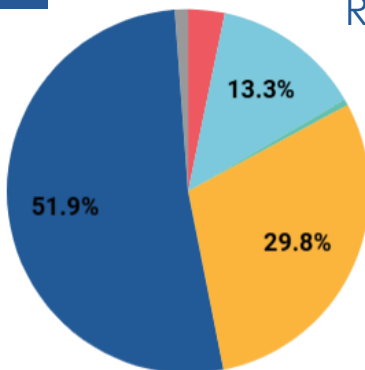
These testimonials offer just a glimpse of the profound impact Growing Together is making in our community—one mother, one family, one newborn at a time.

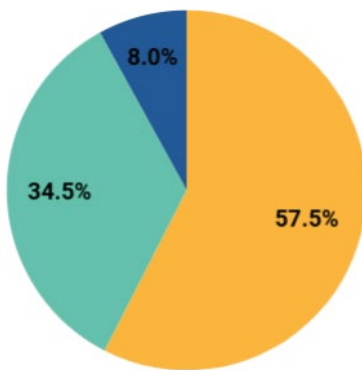
